ear Friends in Rotary As an incoming Assistant Governor, appointed by the first District Governor in D9213 Rtn. John Magezi Ndamira, I have served Rotary as briefly detailed below;

I joined Rotaract club of Lukuli Nanganda in 2003, I served through all the club positions right from attendance officer to Club President (2008/2009), Assistant District Rotaract Representative – Uganda (ADRR- Uganda 2009/2010) and thereafter I joined the Rotary Club of Kampala North in November 2010 and served as New Generations Chair x2, Club Secretary x2, Service Projects Chair x2, Cub Vice President and later President 2019/2020

Further to the experience gained over the years, I have specifically trained through a district team training seminar (DTTS, February 19 -20th, 26th-27th 2021 online)

My roles and responsibilities towards the clubs I shall be serving Rotary through under Area 8 (Rotary clubs of Kiwatule, Bukoto, Kampala Naguru, Kampala Springs, Kyadondo and Nakasero Central) shall briefly be as follows;

- Principle Assistant of the District Governor responsible for Area 8 clubs, in charge of overseeing the administration of the designated clubs.
- Assist Incoming Presidents and clubs prepare and later implement the club planning guide (ongoing)
- Assist Incoming Club Presidents assess their clubs and develop goals (ongoing)
- Review Progress made towards these goals on a quarterly basis and report to the DG quarterly
- Encourage clubs to follow through with suggestions from the DG and keep him Informed about progress of the clubs and address problems and suggest ways to enhance Rotary development
- Officially visit clubs at least once every quarter to discuss club business and related matters and monthly to meet the club leadership and club members
- Represent the DG at club assemblies and attend each club assembly associated with the DG visit



- Acts as Liaison between DG and club and assist the club leaders in planning and scheduling the DG's visit
- Monitor club performance with regard to service projects
- Identify and encourage the development of future Rotary leaders and advise the incoming DG on district committee selection

However, all the above can only be done with the cooperation of the incoming Presidents, secretaries and club officials, with a few outlined assumptions and Risks as below

- That the club leaders will be available and cooperative
- That communication channels will be open
- That the clubs have paid their mandatory dues
- That the Information needed is available when needed

I am looking forward to serving Rotary above self with you all and continuously learning and sharing with you in great fellowship, as we serve to change lives



My sixth goal is to increase the annual giving of TRF to 20,000 dollars.

My seventh goal is membership expansion of the club.

My eighth goal is to continue with the malaria project in Kamwokya Mulimira zone.

My nineth goal is to continue the visual impaired Project in partnership with the Bible society.

My tenth goal is to receive our District Governor Mike Sebalu in the DSCON Navaisha.

As we serve in our different roles, I challenge us to create something that will live beyond each of us to demonstrate our contribution to the vision statement unpacked by our 2021-2022 Rotary International President Shekhar Mehta that says, "do more and grow more to serve and change lives."



10. Carried out a Rotary Family Health Day in Bukalaagi Health Center iii in Gomba where we gave free medicines, food and public health education.

11. Supplied food items , clothes and COVID 19 sensitization in Kabutemba in Gomba.

12. Launched and implemented the Bucket project where we supplied food items and house cleaning materials to St . Andrew's Church in Bukoto, Kiira Police Station.

13. Visited Teresa Babies home / Orphanage where



vwe delivered food items , cleaning/sanitizing items, toys and more .

14. Gave two Vocational Awards to Dr. Chrysostom Miyingo and Mr. Simon Peter Mukhama the CEO of the Bible Society of Uganda for the exceptional support to the various communities .

15. Innitiated support to and skilling the blind communities with the Bible Society of Uganda.

16. Participated in the Mission Green project where we planted 200 trees at Royal Palm Nursery and Primary School - Seeta Mukono.

17. Launched and participated in the Fitness and Nutrition Signature program of DG Rossetti Nabbumba Nayenga .

18. Successfully hosted the DG for a visit where two projects were launched and later implemented and new members inducted into the club .

19. Mentored youth , hosted the Rotaractors for a retreat, implemented joint activities with the Rotaract Club of Bukoto, sponsored 35 youths to attend RYLA and gave them Rotaractors a platform to make presentations to the club .

21. Celebrated the 18th Charter day where all Past Presidents were recognized . The DG was the Chief Guest

22. Successfully hosted the Makerere Rotary Peace met and greet event .

MISSION GREEN PROJECT 2021-2022
