Contribution to TRF	20 PHF; 3 Major Donors DGE Mike Sebaalu is a benefactor, bequest society, a Paul Harris Society member and a level 2 major donor. This year's giving so far is \$4000 against our Annual Target of \$20,000 towards TRF and collection of \$382 for Polio Plus against our Annual target of \$2200 to Polio plus.

The school infrastructure is fairly dilapidated with the kitchen and toilet most affected. The total project cost is \$61800
